CARDINAL NUMERALS

When paired with a masculine noun, it remains "один," but with a feminine noun, it transforms to "одна." In plural forms, as in "три" (three), the numeral does not change regardless of the noun's gender, illustrating an essential pattern in nominal declension.

Examples:

Masculine: один стол (one table)

Feminine: одна книга (one book)

Plural: три стола (three tables)

ORDINAL NUMERALS

Ordinal numerals (e.g., first, second, third) also decline according to the gender and case of the nouns they modify. They generally have unique endings that reflect both gender and number. For example, in German, the ordinal numeral "erste" (first) takes the form "erster" for masculine nouns and "erste" for feminine nouns, while the plural form is "erste" for all genders.

Examples:

Masculine: der erste Platz (the first place)

Feminine: die erste Idee (the first idea)

Plural: die ersten Plätze (the first places)

VARIATIONS AND IRREGULARITIES

Some numerals exhibit irregular patterns in declension. For instance, the numeral "два" (two) has unique forms: "двух" in the genitive case and "двум" in the dative case, which diverges from the standard declension patterns.
